This is something our junior committee will be discussing in the coming weeks with our coaches, on what WE AS A CLUB can do to teach our players to be tackling correctly. No family or player wants to be responsible for seriously injuring another player or be on the end of your child being injured so seriously they are taken away in an ambulance. As a parent of a child who plays at East Burwood I could not be any prouder of the clubs decision a couple of years ago to have a fully qualified medic at ALL of our home games and the expertise of our volunteer trainers we have at our club. Their dedication to looking after our children and children of other clubs at any game they attend if very re-assuring to know our kids are in good hands.

Our two Under 10 teams head to Pinks Reserve this week to compete in the Lightning premiership and we wish both teams the best of luck, I know the kids love this whole day event along with the parents.
